2024 was a year of immense challenges — gang violence, political instability and economic turmoil have all left lasting scars. Yet, our Haitian brothers and sisters refuse to allow these challenges to define them or act as barriers to progress. Remarkably, amidst the ongoing trials, we have made significant strides together in every area of our Social Support Model's Five Pillars (Empowerment, Education, Nutrition, Healthcare and Infrastructure), ultimately moving our Haitian friends closer to realizing their own independence and self-reliance.

2024, it would be *transformation*. Merriam Webster defines transformation as a thorough or dramatic change in form or appearance. And thanks to the unwavering support of our donors paired with the resilience of those we work alongside, transformation is taking place. The following represent only a small portion of the many incredible milestones we accomplished together.

If we had to choose one word to describe

significant strides made in family preservation

In 2024, Overture International, driven by a resolute commitment to transforming the landscape of child welfare in Haiti, made significant strides in family preservation, ensuring the most vulnerable — the children of Haiti — grow up in the loving care of a family. Since 2020, with Overture's support and in partnership with local agencies like IBESR (Haiti's child welfare agency) and BPM (Haiti's judicial arm for child protection), **five orphanages have been closed** (four of which were closed in 2024), allowing for more than **400 children** to leave institutional care and reunite with families — where they truly belong.

Our strategic partnerships have strengthened Haiti's child welfare system. By using our Les Cayes campus (formerly ESPWA) for timely

crisis care interventions, local agencies are now equipped to provide immediate support to children separated from their families, expediting reunification and ensuring they spend less time in limbo. True transformation requires collaboration, leadership and community. Enel Andre, Overture's Social and Community Manager, shares how we are building a stronger Haiti together through sustainable, community and agency-driven solutions.

In 2024, our partnership with IBESR grew significantly as we worked more closely to address critical child protection issues. We supported IBESR in expanding the foster care system in southern Haiti by introducing specialized foster families for children with special needs. Before this milestone, there were no viable familybased solutions for these abandoned children in the South, leaving IBESR no choice but to place them in an orphanage. Today, every child without parental care is now placed in a qualified foster family. This innovative approach is transforming Haiti's child protection system, ensuring that even the most vulnerable children grow up in safe, nurturing homes rather than institutions.

pilot project (aunched) for underprivileged youth

In 2024, Overture International launched a pilot project as part of the Rejuvenation Program to support the most underprivileged youth in our community, providing them with a pathway to stability and self-sufficiency. Through a selective application process, **10 participants** were chosen, encouraging them to take ownership of their futures. These young individuals received occupational training and were equipped with essential job skills, while many gained hands-on experience through work on our campus. This initiative not only empowers youth but also fosters long-term economic independence, reinforcing Overture's commitment to sustainable community development

and breaking the cycle of poverty for Haiti's most vulnerable — the children. According to Pierre Peronneau, Overture Program Manager and LSW, the new initiative is already making a marked difference in the lives of the youth and their families.



This program has had profound impact on both young participants and their families, providing financial relief and professional opportunities. Many families rely on small-scale farming and cannot afford education or training, making this program a crucial support system. For the youth, it offers more than just job skills — it builds confidence and essential workplace abilities like teamwork and communication. Their integration into Overture's professional corps provides stability, while vocational training sets them on a path to independence. By breaking cycles of poverty and reducing risks of criminality, this initiative empowers Haiti's most vulnerable youth to shape their futures.

Dory Dome Community Center fully activated

The activation of our Dory Dome Community Center is in full force and has made a lasting impact in southern Haiti, serving as a vital hub for community-building and family support. The Center hosted 14 child protection events and 15 healthcare education events, reaching 875 attendees. Additionally, 12 psychosocial events supported children's well-being, while Overture responded to three cases of violence and five crises. The Dory Dome Community Center is transforming lives, strengthening families and creating a safer, more resilient community for the future. In addition, in 2024 we completed two disaster-resistant homes — built by Haitians for Haitians — providing secure housing for families in need, with more home projects continuing into 2025.

The Dome Center is an important asset that is providing a central space for learning, communicating and engaging.



The completion of this Dome Community Center signifies a beacon of hope for the Dory community, emphasizing that true development comes from within and requires support from both local agencies and community members. As a social worker, I have witnessed how this space brings people together to address issues, prioritize actions and collaborate on solutions needed for overall growth. Families now have access to child protection and healthcare education, children are receiving psychosocial support and those in crisis are able to find immediate help. The Center is more than a building — it's a place of hope, resilience and empowerment. Every day, we see lives being strengthened, proving that when a community has the right resources, it can thrive.

Nearly five years ago, we transformed the ESPWA campus from a traditional orphanage model into a vibrant community center, dedicated to empowering families, strengthening communities and boosting the local economy in southern Haiti. Year after year, this campus of hope continues to drive meaningful change and create lasting impact for generations to come.

The campus also continues to mature and evolve. At Overture, we recognize that true transformation not only requires collaboration, leadership and community, but also the ability to pivot and adapt as needed. As we enter 2025, we have exciting plans in the works! In partnership with IBESR and BPM, our campus of hope will undergo yet another transformation into the first Community Complex for Child Protection in Southern Haiti. While the campus will remain a vital place for programs of education, nutrition and healthcare, these initiatives will allow the campus to be fully utilized while empowering both local child welfare agencies and Haitian families to better protect children and preserve the family unit. 

Raphaëla's journey

From Hardship to a Loving Home

Meet Raphaëla, a three-year-old girl from southern Haiti who has experienced a significant number of hardships in her young life. Abandoned by her biological family as a baby, she was taken in by another family who later placed her in an orphanage. When the orphanage failed to provide adequate care and voluntarily closed, Overture stepped in to assist Haiti's child welfare agency (IBESR) with the safe removal, family tracing and reunification efforts for every child living in the orphanage, including Raphaëla. Thankfully, most of the children were successfully

reunited with their families. Sadly, Raphaëla's family could not be found.

Determined to find her a safe and loving home, Overture identified a foster family through IBESR's foster family network. Guerline, a woman in Les Cayes, eagerly embraced Raphaëla as her own, committing to her care, education and future. After months of preparation and training, Raphaëla was happily placed with Guerline and her new family.

Raphaëla's transition into her foster home has been filled with joy and emotional connections like she has never before known in her short life. She has formed a strong bond with her foster mother and is thriving in her new environment where she is being nurtured, loved and supported as all kids should.

Overture remains committed to Raphaëla's well-being, providing continued psychosocial and educational support to both Raphaëla and her foster family. This story is a testament to the collective efforts of IBESR, Overture and the community. We believe that by prioritizing family-based care over institutional settings, we are giving children the love and stability they deserve. And we recognize that true transformation requires

collaboration, leadership and community, which is why we will continue to partner alongside IBESR to end the harmful orphanage system in Haiti by helping to locate safe homes (birth or foster families) where children are set up for their best possible chance of success.

And so far, 2025 is off to a great start! In January, Overture has successfully reunited eight children with their families, reinforcing our dedication to continue strengthening Haitian families and communities.

This story is a testament to the collective efforts of IBESR, Overture and the community. We believe that by prioritizing family-based care over institutional settings, we are giving children the love and stability they deserve.
